Arts Park Maintenance - The Weeding Gang

Thanks to all who have been able to join Kathy and Ken Goble in the maintenance of the Arts Park so far! The wildflower bed looks great..... cared for and wild at the same time.

There are still some weeding nights available, August 9, August 23 and September 6. Bring good gloves as there are Canada Thistles that will be quite nasty. Also, bring your favorite weeding tools. We do have some available but not many.

Finally, a couple of wildflower tidbits for two of our current bloomers:

Small- leaved Everlasting (also known as Pussy Toes)

Fifteen species of Pussy-toes grow in Alberta. These plants get their common name of Pussy-toes from the tiny,soft,fuzzy flower clusters which resemble a kitten's paw. They grow in dry, open grasslands, pastures and on eroded banks.

Gaillardia (also Blanket Flower or Brown-eyed Susan)

Gaillardia is very common farther south in Alberta and in the Rocky Mountains, where it can be seen growing in gravel by the side of the road. It grows in a few isolated patches in the Edmonton area, mainly on south-facing slopes. The fragrant flowers are especially attractive to butterflies.

Decorative Streetlights

There have been some inquiries about why the streetlights are being replaced. As a part of our neighbourhood renewal, all streetlights in Belgravia will be changed to LED fixtures. In mature neighbourhoods, the majority of the lighting systems are at the end of their life expectancy. Deteriorated poles, bases and wiring require replacement to ensure safe, efficient operation and reduce future repairs. What is Replaced?

- Street Light Poles new galvanized poles
- Underground Bases new concrete bases
- Electrical wiring system updated wiring to new electrical codes
- Light fixtures new fixtures

Standard galvanized poles are installed with standard light fixtures. Benefits of LED light fixtures over High Pressure Sodium fixtures

- Reduces CO2 emissions
- More energy efficient providing energy savings
- Longevity and decreased energy consumption offer significant maintenance savings
- Control of light dispersion spreads light out evenly and reduces light pollution and light trespass





With the option to enhance the appearance of Belgravia with

Decorative Streetlights, efforts are being made to move forward. Thank you to everyone who provided input and/or attended the meeting to select the Decorative Streetlight design to be pursued for Belgravia. The majority selected the Heritage Arm in Black with the Octagonal Pole.

Estimated Cost

There is an additional cost to property owners for the Decorative Streetlights. Property owners have the choice of paying a one-time lump sum or a yearly payment over 15 years. The following are the cost estimates **for a typical 50 ft lot**:

One-time Cash payment \$360 Yearly rate for 15 years \$36

All property owners will receive an

Expression of Interest (EOI) from the City by September 1. In order to move forward with the Decorative Streetlights we need support from 50% + 1 of the property owners. This means that if you support this initiative you must sign and return the EOI to the City by November 15^{th} .

I have been asked a number of questions regarding the streetlights and the process. The following are the questions and the responses from the City.

 What is the life expectancy of the coloured poles. Is there a difference between the painted and the plain galvanized poles? The powder coated poles are galvanized underneath the powder coating so the life expectancy is the same.



2. What is the durability of all poles?

We have a 7 year warranty on the powder coating.

3. How does the height of the light with the Heritage Arm compare the standard streetlight? There was concern that it was lower and might not be visible through the tree canopy.

The pole height and arm length of the decorative poles and the galvanized davits are the same so light levels are not affected by the decorative options. In areas with heavy tree canopies, we use a shorter pole to reduce the light obstructions created by the trees. The light levels on the road will not be diminished because of the shorter poles.

4. If we are unsuccessful in moving forward with the Decorative Streetlights, do we still have the option of choosing the Decorative Street Address Blades? Is there a cost associated with these blades?

Communities can choose decorative street blades with or without decorative lights. If the communities are not successful with the EOI then the community will be responsible for 100% of the cost of the blades.

5. Since Belgravia is a part of the 106/76 project, what streetlight design will be used on 76 Ave? Will it be consistent with the choice made by Belgravia?

This is currently being reviewed in coordination with the Engage 106-76 concept plan.

- 6. How is the additional cost of the Decorative Streetlights calculated for owners of condominiums? Often the living units, parking stalls and storage spaces all have separate tax roll numbers. For example, if the cost for the assessed lot is \$1,000 cash cost and there are 250 tax roll properties for the condominium the cost for each tax roll would be \$4. If one person owns a living unit, one parking stall and one storage space all with separate tax rolls they would pay \$12 total (3 properties x \$4). Also note that each property with a tax roll has a vote for the EOI. So in the case of the owner above they would have three votes.
- 7. If property owners do not respond to the EOI, is that considered to be "not in favour" of the Decorative Streetlights? That is, the onus is on those who want the Decorative option to respond in favour?

If property owners do not respond to the EOI then that is considered to be a "not in favour". You are correct that the onus for the EOI is for those that are in favour. As these costs do go on the tax roll the City wants to ensure that the majority of property owners are in favour of the project prior to it moving forward.
