

Protecting Our Mature Trees - Ben Henderson

Mature trees are a crucial part of Edmonton's beauty, desirability and livability. What we can do to protect trees largely depends if they are

"city trees" or "private trees." City trees, usually found on boulevards, are public property; as such no person may remove, damage, prune, cut, repair, or preform any other work on a tree without special authorization. The City owns and maintains over 320,000 trees and monitoring them all can be a challenge. If you see work being done that endangers or damages a city tree please call 311 and report it to our urban foresters.

Trees are quite valuable and our older elms can be

\$70,000 - \$100,000. If a tree is damaged, or has to be removed, then the value of that tree is reinvested into the community through plantings. You can find a map of Edmonton's trees as well as value specifications on Edmonton.ca.

Sadly, I can't count the number of times I've heard "That tree is at the end of its life; it's over 70." This is simply untrue. Many of our tree species live past 100, and some of our oak species reach 600. Elms can easily live for 250 years. If we properly care for our trees, they will be here for generations to come.

Unfortunately, no matter how old or majestic there is nothing the City can do to prevent a private tree from being cut down. We have explored a variety of tools, but they each have loopholes too large to be effective. Other provinces have passed special legislation enabling their cities to protect private trees and we are lobbying the province to make these changes here. If you care about this issue I would encourage you to contact your

MLA.

For now we're adding trees as required landscaping. This cannot prevent someone cutting down a mature tree, but it does require a minimum number of trees be planted. If a developer keeps a mature tree it will count extra towards that requirement.

Administration has committed to me that we will now water and fertilize trees 1 year in a d v a n c e of Neighborhood Renewals. This is in addition to the 3-5 years of watering/

fertilizing we already do after construction. When fully replacing a road and sidewalk, it is next to impossible to avoid impact on trees, but this will help the trees have the strength to recover. In addition, I am pushing to require all City trees be hoarded during construction. Hoarding is a protective box placed around the tree, and new rules should be in place this May.

Belgravia Neighbourhood Renewal, Engage 106-76 and Traffic Management

The City of Edmonton presented their preliminary design for the Belgravia Neighbourhood Renewal on March 22. 160 Belgravia residents attended the meeting to view and provide comments on the City's plans for roadways and sidewalks.

The City staff stressed that this is a preliminary design and they want feedback from the residents, as we know our neighbourhood best. All the material presented at the meeting if available online on the City of Edmonton website under Building Great Neighbourhoods - Belgravia/McKernan (west of 114 Street).

The City would like to receive our feedback within six weeks of the meeting (May 3), which they will then use to for the next stage of their design. You can go online to provide your comments.

There will be another meeting scheduled in late 2016 or early 2017 to give the community an opportunity to review the next stage of the design.

The neighbourhood renewal does not include 76 Avenue, as that is being handled by a separate initiative, the Engage 106-76 Project. A meeting is being held on April 7, 2016 at St. Basil's Cultural Centre (10819 71 Avenue), from 3:30 pm to 8:30 pm, to view the draft concept plan for 76 Ave. and 106 St. You can go online and search for Engage 106-76 to get more information on this project.

A third initiative impacting Belgravia is the Belgravia Traffic Management Plan. This project will be starting in late April to address the problems of shortcutting and speeding in Belgravia.
