Decorative Streetlights

A group has come forward with a proposal for decorative streetlights in Belgravia. The process now is that all residents will receive an EOI (Expression of Interest) notification from the City. Each household will then have the opportunity to vote for or against having decorative streetlights. The following pieces represent the two opposing positions on the decorative streetlight issue.

Yes to Decorative Streetlights

Some neighbours have asked why we are pursuing decorative streetlights. The answer is that our streetlights <u>will be replaced</u> as a part of the scheduled neighbourhood renewal and we have the option to choose decorative lights.

As an already beautiful neighbourhood, one in which we all take pride in looking after our homes, we now have the opportunity to further enhance the streetscape with a black pole and a decorative light rather than the galvanized poles. The new roads and sidewalks will improve the appearance of Belgravia and decorative lights will be the "icing on the cake"!

Just as with everything we do to maintain and improve the appearance of our properties, there is a cost associated with the decorative option, albeit a very minimal one. The average frontage in Belgravia is 15.24 m. or 50 ft. With the estimated cash rate per meter of \$12.70 this means the total cost to most

property owners for decorative streetlights would be either a lump sum of \$193.55 or an annual cost of \$15.24 paid over 15 years. A beautified neighbourhood can only serve to enhance our property values making it likely that the small additional expense associated with the decorative lights will be offset.

The City has prepared the EOI which will be sent to all property owners on September 1. To ensure that we can move forward with the Decorative Streetlights, please sign and return the document to the City or stop by the table at the Grand Opening of our Community Hall on Saturday, September 17th.

In June, some residents selected a "Decorative Streetlight" design for the Neighbourhood Renewal Program. The City is responsible for the cost of "standard, non-powder coated streetlight poles and luminaires, and will only install "decorative streetlights", if Property Owners agree to the additional costs. The Octagonal design costs 15% more. Some of us believed this option was not being pursued, due to the lack of interest. However, since a design was submitted, the Property Owners will now have to complete an "Expression of Interest", which will direct the City on the type of streetlight to install.

The EOI is your opportunity to voice your opinion. The vote must be 51% to proceed either way. You simply check off your choice on the EOI. If you drive through Belgravia you will notice that most of our streetlights can't be seen because of large trees. So, some of us question: "Why we would want pay additional taxes for something we don't see?" As a long-term resident, I ask that you consider the additional costs, when completing your EOI. In Lendrum, the 2015 cost was \$3,515 per house for decorative lights and sidewalks. Costs will be more for the Belgravia upgrade. This could be difficult for some, so please consider the options carefully and help us keep the cost of living in Belgravia reasonable! Pictures of the streetlight choices are included. How to Deal With Parking Issues in Belgravia

With its proximity to various medical facilities, the LRT station and the University, Belgravia experiences frequent parking by vehicles whose destinations are not within the community. For this and other practical reasons, many of Belgravia's roads have various types of parking restrictions, clearly marked by signs.


Where there are no signs restricting parking, or where motor vehicles have visible permits indicating that they are not subject to the signed restrictions where they park, standard vehicles may be parked for up to 72 hours without being moved, except in special circumstances such as snow clearance or street cleaning activities.

If you notice vehicles parked illegally on a regular or repeated basis, you may report

them to Edmonton Police Services at 780-423-4567 and indicate that you are calling with a parking concern. Be prepared with details such as locations, times, licence plate number(s) and vehicle description(s) such as make, model, colour, and approximate year if known. City policy for repeat offenders includes towing the vehicle if it receives more than three parking violations within a three block radius.

Residents who leave abusive or threatening notes on parked vehicles or deliver verbal abuse or threats to people parking vehicles, no matter whether legally or illegally parked, may be reported to police and may be subject to law enforcement consequences.

Hall Opening Coming Fast!

The opening of the renewed community hall is coming up fast. We faced some delays this summer, largely because of rain, but the doors will open soon.

This project was made possible by the remarkable financial contributions of people in Belgravia. Our fundraising campaign promised anyone contributing \$1000 or more an invitation to a Hall Preview Reception prior to the Grand Opening Celebrations. The response was amazing: we received 113 contributions of \$1000 or more, including eleven of \$5000 and six of \$10,000 or more, and all these contributors have been invited to a Hall Preview Reception on September 11.

The Grand Hall Opening on September 17 is open to everyone in the community with a ribbon cutting ceremony slated for 1 pm and after that, the hall begins working for us, marking the end of phase one of our hall renewal. The second and final phase is set for late next spring, when solar-electric panels will be installed on the south roof, generating enough electricity to power the hall from the sun. Then we'll have another celebration (or should we say "solar-bration").

This project was as much about building our community as about building a hall. The energy of the volunteers on the hall renewal committee and the BCL board of directors never faded because the support from across the neighbourhood was inspiring. Contributions came in many forms: kids holding lemonade sales; big contributions from unexpected sources; comments of friendly encouragement; and heavy-lifting from men and women who moved out the furniture and a year later moved it back in. The list goes on and on.

Every contribution helped, no matter what or how small it was.

A giant hug goes out to the people of Belgravia for helping fulfill our dream-- A Hall for All.

Engage 106-76 Community League Update September 2016

On April 7, 2016 Engage10676 held an Open House to get feedback on the draft concept plan for 106 Street and 76 Avenue. We had a spectacular turnout, with 349 people attending. The draft concept plan presented that evening was the culmination of almost a year of public consultation with Community Partners, led by a core team of community volunteers and City staff.

Based on feedback received, the City Design Team then found ways to improve the concept plan further and better achieve the project's goal: To transform 106 Street and 76 Avenue into walkable, bikeable, liveable public spaces that connect people.

The Queen Alexandra concept plan has been finalized within City of Edmonton internal departments and City staff are putting the finishing touches on concept plans for Allendale, McKernan, Strathcona, and Belgravia. Work on the Belgravia concept plan is also being coordinated with the Belgravia Community Traffic Management Program. We will begin to reengage with the communities of Pleasantview and Empire Park over coming months.

Engage 10676 will be hosting a Celebration event in late September/early October to present the final concept plans. The plans at this point will be final and this will be your opportunity to learn more about how your feedback influenced the concept plans.

The Celebration event will also serve as the kickoff to consultation on the preliminary/detailed designs. This includes things like wayfinding, where to replace trees within the neighbourhood, and useful places for bike racks. Later on, Community Partners may also be invited for additional feedback on design features.

If you have not signed up for the project, please do so by going to our project website, engage10676.info. Signing up as a Community Partner says that you're interested in the project and want to participate in making it a success. You have ideas and experiences to share, and you want to make the streets work well for everyone, no matter how they choose to travel.

September 16 for residents to experience and consider. A second public event will be held later in the fall.

BACKGROUND

During public engagement for Belgravia Neighbourhood Renewal and the Engage 106/76 projects, residents, businesses, and other community stakeholders expressed concern about significant traffic issues in Belgravia.

In response, the City of Edmonton is partnering with the community to examine traffic challenges and explore potential traffic management solutions through a Community Traffic Management Plan (CTMP). Feedback from residents on the other projects has provided a starting point for Belgravia traffic management.

FAQ

WHAT CAN I EXPECT AT THIS PUBLIC EVENT?

Two different types of traffic calming measures will be temporarily installed around Belgravia: curb extensions and a raised crosswalk. The "street lab" will allow residents to experience these measures as both pedestrians and drivers. The "street lab" will be followed by group discussions about what you saw and how your experience can be applied to traffic management in the neighbourhood.

WHAT IS INVOLVED IN A "STREET LAB"?

The "street lab" is a short-term installation of potential traffic measures to effectively address shortcutting and speeding issues. The installation period will allow residents to experience what it would be like to live with these measures. Their locations do not reflect identified hot spots, but rather offer an experience of what they might mean for Belgravia.

WHERE WILL THE STREET LAB TEMPORARY TRAFFIC MEASURES BE LOCATED?

Curb extensions at:

Raised crosswalk at:

- 78 Ave/116 St
- 77 Ave/115 St
- 75 Ave/116 St
- 74 Ave/118A St

WHAT IS A CURB EXTENSION?

A curb extension is a widened sidewalk that can reduce pedestrian crossing distance and narrow the roadway. Curb extensions can be installed at intersections or mid-block.

Considerations of curb extensions:

- Reduce pedestrian crossing distance and time.
- Make pedestrian crossing points more visible to drivers.
- Place the pedestrian in the driver's field of view.
- Prevent drivers from passing turning vehicles.
- May visually enhance the street through landscaping.
- Define and protect parking.
- May create winter roadway maintenance concerns.

WHAT IS A RAISED CROSSWALK?

Raised crosswalks are constructed 3-4 inches above the roadway. They typically have a profile similar to a speed table and are intended to reduce vehicle speeds where pedestrians will be crossing.

Considerations of raised crosswalks:

- Reduce vehicle speeds.
- May generate noise from vehicles decelerating, accelerating, and crossing the speed table.
- May create winter roadway maintenance concerns.

Meet Your Neighbour - Bill Smale

Billy Smale, his wife Lynn and son, Hue moved into their lovely new home in our neighbourhood last December. When asked 'Why Belgravia?", Billy talked about how peaceful and beautiful the community seemed when they came this way to visit Lynn's parents or to walk their dog in the off leash park. With the river valley, University Avenue, the LRT and Belgravia Road as clear boundaries, it seemed more like a small town than just another community in the city. They discovered how easy it was to talk to people and how they in turn were so connected to others in the neighbourhood. Living close to the U of A where Lynn works, Whyte Avenue and the LRT were added bonuses. To Billy, it was the first time since living in Edmonton for the past 15 years that a community actually felt like 'home'.

And we're pretty lucky to count Billy as our neighbour. One of the first things he did after receiving the Belgravian newsletter in his mailbox was to get involved in the BCL. When we met him, we discovered some pretty amazing things about him ... like his having been a provincial, national and international competitive rope skipper with a national speed record that stood for 10 years! In fact, he was the Alberta Coach for rope skipping when he was only 19 and went on to be Team Canada's head coach for international competitions.

It is no surprise to learn that Billy's expertise in skipping lead to career opportunities in health promotion. These included the Heart & Stroke Foundation's Jump Rope for Heart Program and the U of A's School of Public Health's Apple Schools Health Promotion Initiative where he facilitated and built programs around healthy eating, active living and student leadership.

This fall Billy starts some courses towards his MA in Public Engagement at the U of A and begins his first term as a community representative on

the Edmonton Food Council and the City Council's Initiative on Public Engagement. The BCL will benefit from Billy's volunteer spirit when he facilitates the first of our 2016-17 Made in Belgravia series this fall. Stay tuned for details about his session on Youth and Community Leadership as we work the details out with him.

And maybe, if we're really lucky, someday we'll talk Billy into giving us a few tips on rope skipping too!
