

## Let the Sun Shine On ... the New BCL Hall Solar Panels

If you walked by the BCL Hall in the past week or so you may have seen a lot of activity up top when 46 solar panels were installed on the south roof and canopy.



Electricity from the panels goes onto the electrical grid, causing the electric meter to run in reverse and earning a credit for the league. When the panels aren't generating electricity the league draws power off the grid just as before. Over the course of a year the credits will offset most of the costs.

If the community league offsets all its electrical consumption with solar energy, it is equivalent to reducing just over ten tonnes of emissions from coal-fired power plants. That's equivalent to about 210 trees.

The installation of these panels was made possible by grants from the Canada 150 program of Western Economic Diversification Canada; the Community Initiatives Program of Alberta of the Government of Alberta Community Lottery Fund; the Alberta Municipal Solar Plan; and by the many contributions of the people who live in Belgravia. ## **Belgravia Traffic Management Plan**

The City's Community Traffic Management Team has been working in the Belgravia community over the last few years to listen to the concerns from residents and work to find solutions to traffic issues in the neighbourhood. Working in conjunction with the Engage 106-76 project, the Neighbourhood Renewal team, the Belgravia Community League and other stakeholder groups, extensive public engagement resulted in the development of a Community Traffic Management concept plan, which was presented to the community on October 5, 2016. Trial traffic management measures were subsequently installed in a few locations within the neighbourhood to see if they would be effective and if the community would support them.

As the trial period is nearing the end, Belgravia residents are invited to participate in an online survey to share thoughts about the trial traffic management measures that are being tested in the neighbourhood. The survey is open from May 17 to June 18. Residents can participate by going to www.edmonton.ca/belgraviatraffic . The survey can also be printed and completed, and mailed to the City of Edmonton.

The Community Traffic Management Plan trial measures were scheduled for removal this spring. However, the preliminary traffic speeds and volume data suggest that the plan has been effective, and the community response so far has been positive. The Community Traffic Management Team is considering leaving the trial measures in place until they can be permanently constructed with Neighbourhood Renewal in 2017/2018. The results of the traffic speed and volume surveys can be found at edmonton.ca/belgraviatraffic.


An additional raised crosswalk has been proposed on Saskatchewan Drive on the south side of the intersection with the University Avenue service road in response to resident feedback received during the consultation process. The survey includes an invitation to comment on this proposal.

## off-leash PARKS FOR PAWS be responsible by:

- 1. Being considerate keep your dog in sight, stay alert for other trail traffic, restrain your dog around other park or trail users and walk on the right.
- 2. Honouring bylaw rules licence, leash, control and pick-up after your dog. Keep dogs 10 metres away from school grounds, playgrounds, sport fields and picnic sites.
- 3. Allowing your dog off-leash only within the boundaries of designated off-leash areas. The sites are all listed in this brochure!
- 4. Walking restricted dogs away from off-leash parks they are not allowed in. These dogs must be leashed and muzzled at all times outside your property.
- 5. Limiting aggressive behaviour immediately leash and check your dog if it acts hostile toward people, dogs or wildlife.
- 6. Training your dog to respond to voice and signal commands.
- 7. Picking up after your dog keep parks healthy and clean for everyone.
- 8. Protecting your dog with vaccinations stop the spread of infectious diseases to wildlife and other dogs.
- 9. Holding back dogs from chasing wildlife coyotes, deer, birds, waterfowl; all creatures great and small living in urban parks need our protection.
- 10.Carrying a leash on every walk restrain your dog where required, especially on trails, and use a leash no longer than 2 metres (six feet).
- **11.Sharing off-leash parks and trails with others** all of Edmonton's parks and trails are multiuse; they belong to all of us!
