President's Message

2018 road construction: it's going to be painful

The 2018 road construction season will be a difficult one for Belgravians. Although the 2017 road construction was wearisome, it did not involve the four-locations that provide the only access into and out of Belgravia. In 2018, all four (76 Ave, Saskatchewan Drive, 115 St, and 119 St) will be closed at some point. This will of course result in even greater congestion when exiting and entering the neighbourhood.

The need for careful coordination of construction timelines for the access roadways was emphasized by many Belgravians at the open house held by the City in November at St. Paul's Church. In addition, the Transportation Committee of the Belgravia Community League has had frequent exchanges and meetings with City staff about construction scheduling and roadway design. The City's lead manager of the project has acknowledged the importance of scheduling and said he will do what he can. But (at least from my perspective) it will be impossible to avoid major inconvenience during construction.

Big changes will be coming to 76 Ave, including a multipurpose path on the north side, a traffic circle at 119 St, and raised crosswalks and narrower lanes to calm traffic. See the finished product between 109 St and Calgary Trail for an idea of what 76 Ave in Belgravia will look like, or visit the Engage 106-76 website at www.edmonton.ca/transportation/on_your_streets/76-ave-106-st-collector-plan.aspx.

During construction 76 Ave will be closed entirely for an unknown period of time and will have only one-lane traffic during other periods. When 76 Ave is closed, we have asked the City to implement temporary measures to facilitate neighbourhood access along the north side of Belgravia. The BCL will work with the City to provide frequent updates leading up to and during construction.

On the positive side, neighbourhood renewal seems to happen only once every sixty years. And most of us have complained about the condition of our sidewalks for years and will be happy to have them replaced.

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
