#### **President's Message**

### **Living with Infill**

At 6:52 am the gargantuan backhoe roars to life and begins to demolish the house that has rested comfortably next to yours for decades. As the dust cloud rises and the work crew exchanges obscenity-filled banter, two of your prized rosebushes are crushed under some wayward caterpillar tracks. There follows twelve months of raucous early mornings, generators and trucks spewing exhaust, mud coating the alley and your garage, pickups filling the parking spots on both sides of the street, and dust settling on every surface of your home and yard. But when it's all done hopefully you and the rest of the block have gained a wonderful family of new neighbours. And that new house, while looming over your property somewhat more than the old one, is rather attractive. Life returns to normal, until the bungalow across the street goes up for sale...

Most of us in Belgravia have experienced this scenario, either as residents of an older home, the family building a new home, or both. And given the large number of smaller, original homes that remain, the scenario will be repeated many more times in the coming years. There are currently about three dozen active infill construction sites in the neighbourhood!

Recognizing the numerous difficulties raised by infill construction, the City of Edmonton has established bylaws that protect the rights of neighbours, and resources to assist them. The City recently revamped and expanded its infill website (www. cityofedmontoninfill.ca/). It has loads of information and many pages to click through. If you are currently dealing with a problematic infill site or preparing yourself for one to come, these resources are very useful.

The Neighbour Construction Information page (www.cityofedmontoninfill.ca/community/infill-in-your-neighbourhood/constructioninformation) includes a checklist with suggestions such as documenting the state of your property (foundation, fences, trees, etc.) before construction begins on an adjacent site. Also be sure to look at the updated Residential Construction Guide for information on what to expect as well as the standards to which the builder must adhere (www.cityofedmontoninfill.ca/public/download/documents/34768). Builders must limit excavation to areas within secure fencing, keep sidewalks clean and clear of debris, work within permitted hours (Monday to Saturday 7 am to 9 pm, and Sundays

and holidays 9 am to 7 pm), protect public trees, and direct runoff to the City drainage system. For an industry perspective on infill practices and issues, consult the website of the Infill in Edmonton Development Association: www.infilledmonton.com/.

The infill process(seewww.cityofedmontoninfill. ca/community/infill-in-your-neighbourhood/ whats-next). If there is to be infill construction next to your property, you will receive a notice from the City. The notice will inform you as to whether you are being asked for input into the project or whether you are simply being informed. If the project complies with all the bylaws, then the notice is for information only. If the applicant wants to do something that does not comply with the bylaw, then you have an opportunity to provide your thoughts on the project. The process for responding to a land development notice is provided at: www.cityofedmontoninfill.ca/community/infill-in-your-neighbourhood/planning-application-in-your-neighbourhood. If the project is approved, you will be notified of your opportunity to appeal.

After final approval, a notice will be posted on the property with the builder's phone number and a file number for the site. If problems arise you should first contact the builder.

If this does not resolve the problem, you can call

#### Meet Your Neighbour: Anita Nawrocki

Anita Nawrocki has lived in Belgravia for 22 years and only when she expressed an interest in doing a Made in Belgravia session did we discover another accomplished artist in the neighbourhood. She and her husband, Neil Lamoureux, initially chose Belgravia as a convenient location for Neil's work place downtown and Anita's in Southgate where she was helping her mother manage their well-known family retail business, Dansk Gifts. With a Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology and sociology from the U of A, along with several introductory arts courses, art had always been a small, quiet hobby for Anita including glass blowing, and acrylic painting. Not surprisingly, Anita's favourite activity at Dansk Gifts was decorating and setting up all the displays.

Adam was born in 1998 and two years later, Anita & Neil discovered Adam had a chronic illness that required Anita to leave Dansk so she could focus on Adam's health. When Adam's health stabilized and after Sophie's birth in 2003, Anita pursued an After Degree in Elementary Education at the U of A. While she re-discovered her joy in creating art during this time, it wasn't until she took 11 year old Adam (who was 'really into coins') to a Strathcona coin & stamp shop that the idea of using stamps as art came to her. The stamps, at the back of the store, caught her eye and inspired thoughts about how easily they could be used to fill an empty canvas she had back at home just waiting to be hung in a particular spot in her hallway. Anita bought a bag of used postage stamps and started gluing. It wasn't long before she "was astounded by the variety of stamps"; how each stamp was a miniature piece of art on its own and even more interesting, what happened when stamps were placed side-by-side and overlapped.

The more she looked at these stamps, the more the possibilities of putting them together emerged. For example, her wondering why one

stamp was worth pennies and another worth thousands, lead to a series called "Precious." Another series entitled "Messages" came about as a result of imagining what was in the letters the stamps had shared. "From Correspondence to TXT" at the Alberta Craft Council was a postage stamp commentary on how society has changed the way it corresponds. Anita's current exhibit 'Stamplified National Pride' at the Muttart Conservatory (until June 14, 2018) is a collection of 24 canvases of stamps that explore what is important to people and their countries.

If you have a box of stamps, maybe a collection you started when you were a kid that never progressed into a serious project, you might consider re-purposing them. Come to Anita's Made in Belgravia session on June 16, 2018 (1 – 3 pm) in the upper BCL hall, see some of Anita's pieces and learn how to create some of your own Postage Stamp Art.
