Volunteers Unite for South Side Market


Volunteers from Aspen Gardens, Riverbend, and nearby communities have united in an effort to establish a new Farmers Market in South Edmonton. The group has inspired an impressive response. In an on-line survey posted by Co-Chair Corrina Chetley-Irwin, over 900 people expressed support for the idea. More impressively, over 30 volunteers, representing 15 different South side neighbourhoods, participated in the first organizational meeting.

Through just that first meeting, the organization managed to establish and staff seven portfolio teams focused on key issues: Community Engagement & Communication, Market Manager Recruitment, Location Selection, Market Structure, Vendor Selection, Promotion & Marketing, and Fundraising. The second meeting, scheduled in Aspen Gardens for June 2, will focus on a detailed strategic plan. Meanwhile those portfolio teams have hit the ground running.

Though enthusiasm is strong for the idea, there are many obstacles to overcome if a new market is to be established. The first of these arose even before the group was founded. In his research on possible locations for the market, Co-Chair Greg Meimar identified what seemed to be an ideal market location: the abandoned site of a former IGA on 119 Street in Lansdowne. The owners of this property seemed open to the possibility of a market, but a restrictive covenant (RC) placed on the deed by former owner Safeway Inc., prohibits any competitive business activity there — even a farmer's market. Cathy Raftis, Director of Edmonton's City Wide Planning Section, confirmed that Safeway has similar RCs imposed on several properties in Edmonton. According to Raftis, Provincial law provides very little authority for the City to override these RCs.

Safeway's restrictions over this, and other possible market locations, clearly frustrates many of the volunteers involved in this project. Nonetheless, the group is moving on and gaining momentum. With all that they have accomplished already, it is easy to imagine that by next year South Edmonton will have its own Farmer's Market.

More volunteers and financial support are still needed. In particular the group is looking for more volunteers for the fundraising, location selection, and market manager recruitment teams. 



IMPORTANT CHANGES TO HOCKEY and MEMBERSHIP SALES PROCESS

Confusion Clearing Around Hockey Registration & League Memberships

As with all new processes communication and details need sorting out. This update addresses concerns we have heard from leagues to date. Complete information can be read online

- The Corporate Rate for Memberships of \$25 was set as an average rate for community league memberships
- League fees vary and each organization will set its own policy on how to administer the Corporate Rates and how it will work for the circumstances of their league
- Hockey Edmonton jointly with the EFCL has determined that as part of the streamlined process
 it is unnecessary for leagues to be present at registrations and that they will charge the \$25 Corporate Rate Membership Fee to all families that register for hockey as approved by Community
 League Members at EFCL's annual AGM
- Leagues will receive lists of members for their league after August 15, 2010.
- Leagues will remit cards commencing after receipt of their lists and hopefully in time for August 31. For memberships purchased through hockey after August 15, families that want their cards may contact info@efcl.org We will verify the purchase with their registrar and organize the remittance of their card.
- We understand there may be some duplication, again it will be up to the league to manage discrepancies and duplications. Educate, educate, educate, and hockey parent mistakes will diminish with time. It might be a good idea when selling a membership to ask if the family has registered for hockey by any chance.
- EFCL recommends that the leagues hold a meet and greet to invite their new members to get involved and to distribute their cards & skate tags. How this is handled will be a league decision.

Please thank your Hockey Registrars for doing this service for so many years and for the continuing volunteer hours they spend supporting community.

If we cannot improve the process for Hockey Registrars we stand to lose this valuable connection to the sports community.

Workers needed for the 2010 Edmonton Election

Do you want to be at the center of the action, make some extra money and participate in an important election – all in one day?

The 2010 Edmonton Election for Mayor, 12 Councillors, 9 Public School Trustees and 7 Catholic Separate School Trustees is taking place on Monday, October 18, 2010 and workers are needed to staff the voting stations to ensure this important election is effective and efficiently run.

A fair and accurate election is a keystone of our community – but it takes a lot of dedicated people to ensure voters can cast their ballots. This year we need 2,800 workers in 223 voting stations across the city.

Remuneration for positions ranges from \$190 to \$335.

You must be 18 or older to work the Edmonton Election.

Voting stations are open from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day. All workers must remain in the voting station.

All positions require mandatory training that will be held in the weeks before the election. Some positions will also require the use of a vehicle.

Application involves a two-part process – if you apply in person, you will fill out an application and an evaluation document. If you apply and submit your application on line, you will be contacted and asked to complete the evaluation in-person.

Both are open Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m., excluding holidays.

News from Our School

Edmonton Public School Board Sector Planning Review

Edmonton Public School Board (EPSB) is engaging in a Sector Planning review. We heard the term in March 2010, when school closure discussions were held regarding the Hardisty area and Central (downtown) area schools. The process for the review was announced on May 7. The stated goal, "Sector Planning is about making the best possible use of available resources so that all students have access to vibrant schools and a range of quality programs."

Edmonton Public is divided into 9 Sectors and 3 Sectors are being looked at in this review. Belgravia is in the South Central Sector which contains 28 elementary and junior high schools that are south and west of the river as far as Southgate area in the south and Gold Bar/Capilano area in the east. This is a fairly large sector. EPSB states there are many unused spaces in schools in this sector and the number of 0-4 year olds in mature neighbourhoods is shrinking while growth continues in less central areas. The opening of new schools in the newer areas of the city will result in more unused spaces overall.

90.8% of Belgravia property owners direct the school portion of property taxes to Edmonton public. Across the City 75% of population directs their taxes to the public system (2008 Edmonton census).

Public Engagement is part of this review and EPSB has hired an Ontario firm to handle the consultation. They have done work in Edmonton before. One of the steps happening right now is a Workshop for School Parent Councils, Community Leagues and Community organizations. Belgravia has representatives from the league and the school attending this workshop.

Please participate in the next step of the process by attending a Community Forum and completing a workbook either at the forum, online or in print. Turnaround is very tight. Forum is scheduled for May 29 and completed Workbooks must be submitted for June 18th.

Workbooks—Starting May 11 an online fillable pdf version of the workbook is available on the www.sectorreview2010.com website and a small number of hard copies have been distributed in schools. The workbook provides important information and facts and asks lots of questions. Tell us what is important to you about your community and use of school space. Share ideas, issues and concerns that you think should be included in sector review.


