Vice President's Message

As Belgravia residents know, our neighbourhood continues to be at the confluence of a striking (and often overwhelming) number of developments. We're adapting—mostly for the better, but not without some distress, to these developments.

For example, with southward expansion, the LRT continues to grow in ridership, as well as train car length and frequency. A neighbourhood amenity to be sure, but now often a challenge to board at peak hours and a significant factor in creating cut-through traffic and line-ups.

The stalling of the EXPO 2017 bid shifts sole attention back to the University of Alberta's plans for the development of South Campus and concerns about the consequences of these plans. Most Belgravians understand that South Campus should be developed, but drawing on the best standards in planning, consultation, building and site design. This development has and will continue to affect this neighbourhood.

The building of Alberta Health Services clinics on the north side of University Avenue affects coming and going from our neighbourhood at the 115th Street intersection, one of Belgravia's few access points by car. And all of these developments have a role in non-resident motorists using Belgravia's streets as a parking lot.

Along with these challenges, there are equally opportunities to shape the kind of neighbourhood most residents would like it to be. Our character has been suburban, although mingled with the distinct influences of river valley park, a central location and the moats of commuter arteries on three sides. New developments within and on the periphery are making parts of the neighbourhood more urban in character. In this respect, Belgravia is a living laboratory for a whole set of planning issues. But for residents, its our home.

Important initiatives that you can get involved in are helping with this transition. One of the most important of these is the South Campus Neighbourhood Coalition (SCNC). The SCNC was recently founded through the support of MLA Kevin Taft and the Riverview constituency office. The aim of the SCNS is to influence and shape South Campus development. If you're interested, the SCNC requires one or two neighbourhood representatives, so please contact the BCL executive for more information or visit. Or if you're just interested, attend the next meeting on the evening of February 7th at the Belgravia Community Hall.

Another development: As part of the bicycle transportation plan to reduce dependency on motor vehicles, the City of Edmonton has contacted the BCL about plans to create a bike lane on 76th Avenue, from Gateway Boulevard to Saskatchewan Drive. More information and consultation to follow, but you can find out more about this by visiting www.edmonton.ca and searching "bicycle transportation plan". Again, the BCL executive would love to hear from you if you're interested in being more involved in this consultation.

Of course, your community league is a key part of recreational and educational programming in the neighbourhood, as well as facility and parks development. All of these need your participation and support. More than a volunteer organization, BCL is an important network to create and sustain a shared sense of place and community.



At this time of year many of us can't wait for spring and the chance to get out in the garden again. The volunteer gardeners at the Green & Gold Community garden are already making plans for our third gardening season. The garden is located on the University of Alberta South Campus, bordered by the communities of Lendrum, Malmo, Grandview, Lansdowne, Belgravia, McKernan, Park Allen and Windsor Park. The garden is an initiative of the University's School of Public Health and Faculty of Agricultural, Life and Environmental Sciences. Volunteers operate the garden and all of their time, the seeds, plants and equipment used are donated.

The vegetables, herbs and flowers are "spray-free" (no pesticides or artificial fertilizers are used). Anyone is welcome to 'purchase' their vegetables at the garden and every penny of the money raised – that's 100% – goes to the **Tubahumurize Association**, a non-profit organization in Rwanda that provides socially and economically marginalized women with vocational training, counselling, life-skills coaching, health care education, and opportunities for sustainable income generating activities. Most individuals who benefit from Tubahumurize are genocide survivors and many are widows or orphans, HIV infected, and survivors of physical and sexual violence. Last year the garden raised over \$22,000 for the Tubahumurize project. We are now gearing up for the 2011 gardening season, and are looking for volunteers. Volunteers are always needed to help with the garden – both novice & experienced gardeners are always welcome. Or, if you aren't interested in gardening, but would like to help in other ways (distributing produce, promoting the garden, donating seeds or garden tools) please contact us at:
