
Miss getting your new Belgravia Community League membership last month?

#### from the editor's desk...





Seven students from the U of A Lister Hall Base Camp Community Service chose Belgravia's Art Park for the community volunteer experience that was part of their week of orientation to residence living. Katelyn Bohn, Alex Brice, Holly Clayton, Luke Stretch, Calvin Jensen, Tian Zheng, and Rohan Gowda came to the Arts Park for three hours on August 30 and spent most of that time digging weeds out of our shale paths. It was hard work, particularly hard on knees and fingernails, and we appreciate the effort they put into the job. With guidance from Kathy Goble, they also dug out



the heavy clay soil in the center of the labyrinth and replaced it with good quality black earth.

Denise Radford, Ruth Craig and Sylvia Forrow, some of the regular Belgravia volunteer weeders, came at the same time to share the experience with the students. Jeanette Boman and Marie Walker outlined the work that needed to be done and made sure that the workers had the tools they needed. Also, Marie supplied the black dirt and Jeanette brought juice and cookies-hardly comparable but both were appreciated.

#### Mulch Excitement

The Arts Park is a Partners and Parks project. That means that the city does the usual maintenance but the Belgravia Community League is responsible for any care needed by the special features of the Arts Park.

The beds of native flowers and shrubs need care beyond the usual which is why we ask for volunteers to help with these areas. The city does help whenever possible with special needs.

This year we're grateful to Travis Kennedy, Principal of Horticulture for the City, for making arrangements for city crews to supply and deliver a load of mulch for our park. The mulch was delivered before the final weeding bee of the year. As we prepared to wrap up our weeding, we noticed that the city had provided an extra treat for us. The mulch had begun to compost and was about to break into a celebratory bonfire.

The weeding volunteers sprang into action to break down the smoking pile of mulch and spread it out so it wouldn't overheat. Just as everyone was getting tired from handling the extra and unexpected task David Mueller, who lives nearby, came along and saved the day. Thanks to everyone who helped!

#### Hall Renewal Gains Momentum!

This is getting exciting!

We had HUGE interest in the three concept designs for Belgravia Hall when we introduced them at Community League Day, September 21, at (where else?) Belgravia Hall. Thank you everyone.

The three options were based on the community workshops held this spring. They were developed by the architecture firm of Newstudio, who worked with various users and the Hall Renewal Committee. The options were 1) demolish and rebuild; 2) construct a satellite building and renovate the existing hall; or 3) add onto and renovate the existing hall. Many people asked about potential costs, so here are the rough figures: option 1: \$1.8 million; option 2: \$1 million; option 3: \$1.3 million.

A few people wondered about leaving the hall as is, but our hall is heavily used from 7 am to 9 pm most days of the week. With 100-150 users per day it is wearing out. It is unusable for people with mobility problems, leaks energy, and presents other problems. The hall is the heart of our community and we need our heart to be in good shape.

The Hall Renewal Committee will settle on one of the three options for further study, including in-depth engineering assessments to guard against unpleasant surprises such as asbestos or foundation weaknesses.

Then we have to raise the money to pay for it. When this hall was first built in 1955, 250 Belgravia families contributed most of the money to pay for it. This winter, we'll channel the spirit of those initial Belgravia families as we build on their legacy.
