THE BCL IS HIRING A PART-TIME HALL MANAGER

To relieve pressure on some of our key volunteers, the BCL Board of Directors has decided to hire a part-time Hall Manager. This was a difficult decision for the Board, because for many years our league has been able to rely exclusively on volunteers to operate our hall. However, for the past 3 years we have not been able to recruit new volunteers for the positions of facilities director and hall rental coordinator. In fact, our hall rental coordinator has been in this demanding position since our renovated hall opened in 2016. The part-time Hall Manager will assume some of the responsibilities of these 2 positions, making the volunteer positions less demanding and hopefully more attractive to future volunteers. The BCL has sufficient revenue to support the position on an ongoing basis.

Job description: the Hall Manager will work approximately 10 to 15 hours per week. Hourly wage to be determined. Reports to the BCL Director of Facilities.

Key responsibilities include:

- Serve as point of contact for individuals and organizations wanting to rent the community league hall. Explain rates, policies (e.g. current BCL membership is required to rent hall) and procedures. Write up Hall Rental Contract. Once signed contract and rental fee are received, arrange with director of facilities for keypad code to access hall. Orient renter to hall space and supplies. Check cleanliness and condition of hall after rentals.
- Manage the hall security system, including key fobs and electronic access to renters.
- Arrange hall access for contractors responsible for cleaning, furnace maintenance, repairs, etc.
- Monitor hall interior and grounds for maintenance issues and report issues to director of facilities and/or contractors.

BELGRAVIA RINK RENEWAL PROJECT UPDATE

Project overview

The purpose of this project is to replace the BCL's outdoor rink (which is reaching the end of its life cycle) with a new rink that will serve as a sustainable year-round activity area for the community of Belgravia.

Process

The 5-phase redevelopment process was initiated in 2022 and is anticipated to take 2 to 3 more years. It is being coordinated by a project team of 4 community volunteers, which reports to the BCL Board. The Board makes decisions on how to proceed at the conclusion of each phase, subject to City approval. Community engagement is a critical part of this process.



The Strategy Phase – 2022

This phase was designed to set the underlying strategy for the project. A report was submitted to the BCL Board based on the results of a community survey, the experience of other communities with similar projects, and additional research. The report recommended that renewal take the form of a traditional boarded rink with a hard surface (e.g. concrete). This option would facilitate activities like skating and hockey in the winter as well as racquet sports and basketball during the spring, summer and fall. A preliminary estimate for the project was \$450,000 with the costs being covered by a combination of grants, BCL funds and a fundraising campaign. The BCL Board approved the strategy subject to financial resources and on-going assessment.

- Feb–May: Research on best practices, potential issues, budgeting/finance, and concept details
- March: Impact assessment meeting with neighbours located immediately adjacent to the rink, community hall, and Arts Park
- April–May: Open House for Belgravia residents to view and provide feedback on the refined rink renewal concept(s)
- May–June: Report and recommendation submitted to the BCL Board for decision

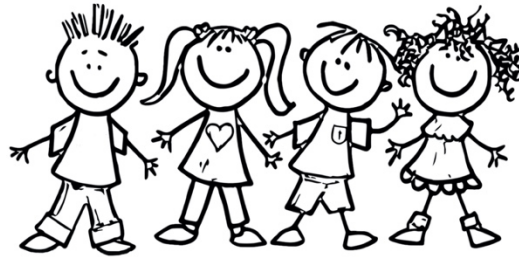
for Belgravia Playschool!

Session 2: Jane Austen (and others) as Young Authors

Presenter: Juliet McMaster

Description

Juliet McMaster, retired English professor and a long-time resident of Belgravia, is probably best known as a scholar of Jane Austen, on whom she has published various books. In exploring Jane Austen's early writings, Juliet fell in love with a slender but cheeky tale Austen wrote at twelve years old, called *The Beautiful Cassandra*.

Being a closet illustrator, Juliet decided to make a picture book for kids of this appealing story turning the characters into small animals dressed in the fashions of the 1780s. It was first published in 1993, in time for the Jane Austen Society of North America conference that Juliet helped convene at the Chateau Lake Louise.

This work led to Juliet's founding of the Juvenilia Press devoted to producing scholarly editions of early works by authors such as the Brontës, Louisa May Alcott, George Eliot, Lewis Carroll, Malcolm Lowry, and Margaret Atwood. The Juvenilia Press has now published about 70 titles, a number of which Juliet has edited and illustrated. All who are interested in learning more about The Juvenilia Press and the processes involved do not want to miss this session. Copies of various works will be available to purchase as well.

Meet Your Neighbour

Wei Yew

Belgravia resident Wei Yew emigrated to Canada in 1976 and opened his own design firm in 1980. Wei and Sheila Laughton, retired ESO cellist, have lived in the same Belgravia home for over 40 years. They love this close-knit community of wonderful neighbours.

Among the many projects to Wei's credit are designs for the 1988 Calgary Olympics Arts Festival, the Royal Tyrrell Museum, Stollery Children's Hospital, Citadel Theatre, Edmonton Valley Zoo and corporations such as Syncrude and EPCOR. Wei developed the branding and exhibit design for the Canadian Book Publishers Association that was used at book fairs around the world.

Wei was commissioned by IOC President Samaranch to design and produce a commemorative centennial book, *The Olympic Image*, which documented a century of design for the Games. He also created logos for the Olympic Truce and the Environmental Olympics. As an authority on Olympic design history, he addressed the 2008 Beijing Organizing Committee for the Olympic Games Design Conference and in 2010 served as a jury member for selecting an emblem for the Vancouver Winter Olympics.

Closer to home, Wei mounted an impressive multimedia production for the IAAF selection committee in Monaco that helped bring the 2001 IAAF World Championships to Edmonton.

What separates Wei's creativity from the work of other designers is his ability to adapt designs to many kinds of media as well as to 3-D formats. While Wei's work is known at the national and international levels, Belgravia residents can see one of his designs in our own neighbourhood. When the BCL hall was renewed in 2016, Wei donated his talent and expertise to create the Donor Recognition Tree which is featured on the wall of the Community Living Room.

Wei Yew's career has given him and his wife Sheila opportunities to travel extensively. Wei's love of travel photography is legendary, and he uses his creative skills to compose each scene with careful consideration of light and colour. On April 21, Wei will share some of his favourite travel photos at our first Made in Belgravia session of 2023 – "Why We Travel" will be an adventure you won't want to miss!

MUFTY'S MUSINGS: MY MEMORIES OF HAWRELAK PARK

I'm one of many Edmontonians who has enjoyed the last of the glorious winter days at Hawrelak Park. It is now closed for 3 years so the City can rehabilitate the utilities, facilities, open spaces paths and roads. I used my eyes and camera to capture memories to last me during the closure.

There is a beautiful panoramic vista before me. A rich deep layer of snow to the lake edge, perfect pale blue ice on the lake for skating and the three roofed building on the plaza across the lake with a fire burning in the new fireplace. The buildings welcome skaters with an indoor place to warm up and change into their skates. To the west, the lake is edged with green spruce and to the north, in the distance, tall apartments on the edge of the North Saskatchewan River in the background. The noon sun is shining while a water truck drives by on the south ice edge of the lake with jets of water spraying out. It leaves a wide track of dark blue ice behind it. I watch skaters of all kinds gliding by on the fresh ice.

A weeping birch tree by the lake edge stands tall, its white bark bright against the muted blue of the ice behind it. The tree's angular branches gracefully rise creating a round canopy that supports last year's slender weeping branches. I have photographed this lovely tree so many times in my years visiting this park. Sometimes with geese resting in its shade, sometimes with children feeding the ducks nearby, sometimes at night with the lights of Edmonton's skyline reflected in the lake behind.

Today, I also photographed another two of my favorite trees. One is on the north side of the 1st Picnic Site parking lot, its arms outstretched in snow creating a beautifully balanced image. The second, at the south end of the same parking lot, has fascinating bark patterns on the trunk. I'm afraid we will lose all three of these old trees that I shot today. The plan is to remove at least 220 trees during the renovation. The City says it will plant many new ones, but these old friends of mine will be missed. Will the park's remarkable spring-blossom trees also survive the makeover? I wonder too where the geese will go during the renos?

Will the City drain the lake first? And then remove the old weeping birches on the islands? There are two major islands in the lake, one at either end. They are covered with spruce, rocks and bushes – perfect places for geese to nest and raise their families.

There is a bronze sculpture at the entrance to the park. The young woman holding a baby up over her head is called "New Life, New Beginning," created to recognize the pioneer spirit that blossomed in Edmonton. The \$400,000 cost was a bequest in the will of Pearl Hawrelak Porter, wife of William Hawrelak.



I'd love to be a drone that prowls the sky over Hawrelak Park as she gets her new makeover. I want to ask the architects to be gentle and thoughtful with our Mother Earth. She will care for us and nourish our spirits, if we care for her. I long to be at the park re-opening in 3 years. It's a big wish as I'm 89 now and have lung cancer. I let the future go and focus on the skaters in front of me as they shift their body weight effortlessly side to side. A little boy skates urgently to keep up with a bigger brother. A loving young couple hold hands and skate in perfect synchronicity.

I will miss you Hawrelak Park, you bring me such peace.

A LOCAL GARDEN WITH GLOBAL IMPACT

The volunteer gardeners at the Green & Gold Community Garden, on the University of Alberta South Campus, are making plans for our fifteenth gardening season! The garden is an initiative of the University's School of Public Health and Faculty of Agricultural, Life and Environmental Sciences. The garden is totally volunteer run and we have benefitted from the generosity of many supporters through donations.

The vegetables, herbs and flowers are “spray-free” (no pesticides or artificial fertilizers are used). Anyone is welcome to purchase their vegetables at the garden and all the money raised goes to the Tubahumurize Association. This non-profit organization in Rwanda provides socially and economically marginalized women with vocational training, counselling, life-skills coaching, health care education, and opportunities for sustainable income generating activities. Most individuals who benefit from Tubahumurize are genocide survivors and many are widows or orphans, HIV infected, and survivors of physical and sexual violence. To date, the garden has raised over \$450,000 for the Tubahumurize project (includes donations and garden/craft sales).

In recent years, we have been making the transition to alternative gardening methods to grow our vegetables, herbs and flowers. These include low-till gardening, creation of permanent beds with pathways to avoid compaction, use of cover crops, alternative mulching, composting and weed management techniques, and succession planting. The amendments we have made to our soil in recent years has improved the production and quality of our produce, created habitat for bees, worms and other beneficial insects, and reduced the human labour required to control unwanted weed production over more traditional gardening methods. This has freed up valuable time for our volunteers to learn about planting, managing crops, and focusing on community building activities in the garden.

We are now gearing up for the 2023 gardening season and are looking for new volunteers to join us – both novice and experienced gardeners are welcome!
