CHARLES SIMMONDS PARK RENEWAL PROJECT: CALL FOR DONATIONS

A final design that focuses on inclusivity and accessibility while retaining open space has been approved for construction in 2024. The playground will remain in its current location and the following enhancements will be added:

1. **Playground:** new playground equipment and accessible wood chip surface
2. **Accessibility:** a paved, asphalt pathway along the north side of the park from 115 Street to the playground will provide access to the park and the playground for people of all ages and abilities
3. **Seating:** seating will be added along the pathway and around the playground
4. **Picnic tables:** permanent picnic tables will be located at the playground and along the path
5. **Covered picnic shelter:** a covered picnic shelter will also be located by the playground.

The total community cost for the project is \$464,000 and we only have **\$28,000 left to raise.**

BELGRAVIA RINK RENEWAL PROJECT UPDATE

Project overview

The Belgravia Community League (BCL) Board has initiated a community-based planning process for renewal of its outdoor rink. The purpose of the project is “to replace the BCL’s outdoor rink, which is reaching the end of its life cycle, with a new rink that will serve as a sustainable year-round activity area for the community of Belgravia.”

Process

The redevelopment process was initiated in 2022 and is anticipated to take 2 to 3 more years. It follows the City of Edmonton’s community led model inclusive of the following phases:



This process is being coordinated by a project team of community volunteers, which reports to the Board of the BCL. The Board’s reviews reports/recommendations and decides how to proceed at the conclusion of each phase of the project. City of Edmonton planners review these decisions to ensure that the project meets City regulations and standards.

Community engagement is a critical part of the project inclusive of: needs assessment, information sharing and consultation – during the strategy, concept and design phases. Success will be judged in terms of how well rink renewal meets community needs through its performance as a recreation and social hub in Belgravia. Strategy Phase (2022)

This phase was designed to set the underlying strategy for the project, a key element being the completion of a needs analysis survey. Based on the results of this survey, the experience of other communities with similar projects, and additional research a Community Led Business Case (Part 1 – Strategy) a report was submitted to the BCL Board with a recommendation **that renewal take the form of a traditional boarded rink with a hard surface (e.g. concrete)**. This option would facilitate activities like skating and hockey in the winter and racquet sports and basketball during the spring, summer and fall. A preliminary estimate for the project was \$450,000, with the costs being covered by a combination of grants, BCL funds and a fundraising campaign. The BCL Board approved the strategy subject to financial resources and on-going assessment inclusive of continued public engagement.

Where we are: Concept Phase (2023)

The Concept Phase of the project is intended to build on the foundations provided in the Strategy Phase. It brings the project concept to life by continuing to explore project feasibility, identifying risks and mitigation strategies, identifying stakeholder requirements, developing a fundraising plan, and hiring or designating a project manager.

Feasibility in terms of capital costs: Due to inflation and the addition of new rink components such as weeping tile to address drainage concerns, the estimated capital costs for the project have increased substantially in the past year. They are now estimated at \$650,000 inclusive of a 15%

contingency buffer. The substantial cost represents a risk to the project, the major mitigation strategy being to scale back the concept to a turf surface rather than a concrete surface, and decrease the cost.

Stakeholder input: A meeting was held with the immediate neighbours of the rink site on March 9, 2023, along with some additional submissions received by email. The purpose of the meeting was to:

- brief neighbours on the proposed renewal concept (four-season outdoor activity centre with boards and a hard surface)
- answer questions on the project
- solicit their views on the potential benefits, negative impacts and ways of mitigating these impacts

Highlights of stakeholder perspectives were as follows:

Benefits

1. easier ice making on a hard surface
2. reduction of current light pollution
3. the replacement of a rink that is rapidly reaching the end of its life cycle

Impact concerns

1. the potential for increased noise especially if pickleball is one of the new activities
2. environmental concerns associated with a hard rink surface
3. possible drainage issues
4. increased management requirements in the spring, summer and fall

Mitigation strategies

1. retain a turf surface
2. incorporate design features such as weeping tile to address drainage issues and berms & planting to buffer noise
3. implement management regulations like restricting the range of activities that would be allowed at the site and the timing of activities

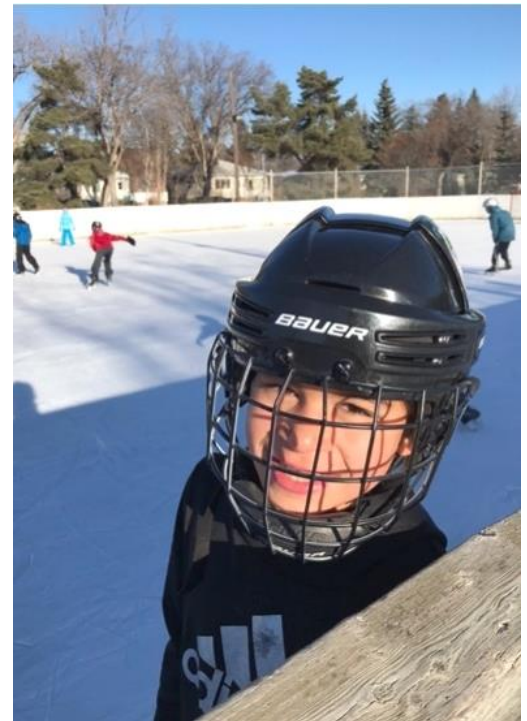

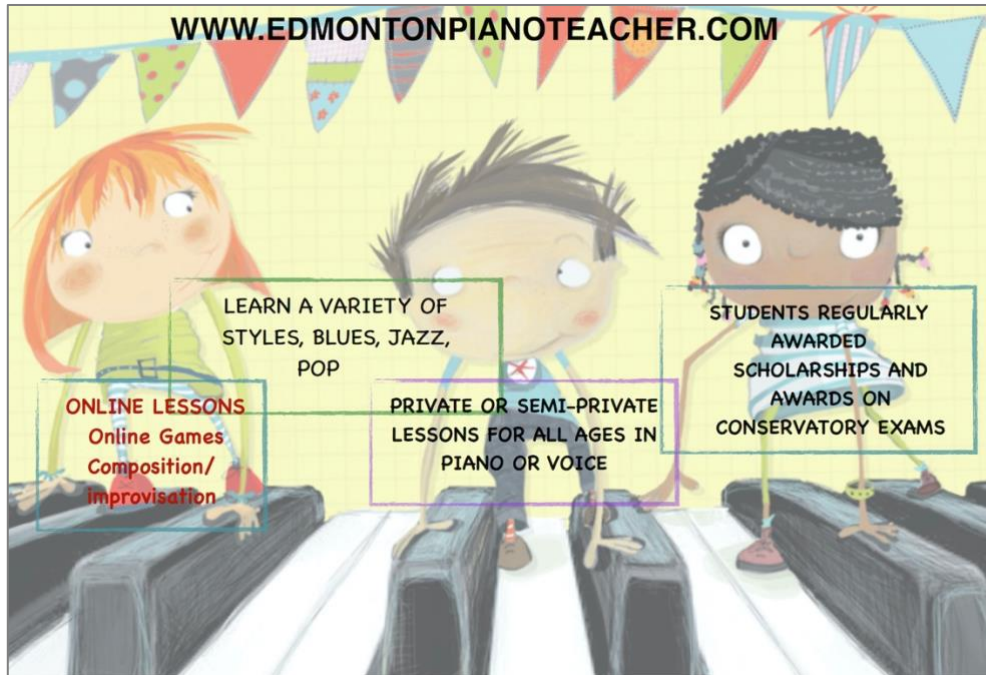

WANTED: BELGRAVIA TREE STORIES

Belgravia has many trees. To start with, Saskatchewan Drive and its ravine ring around the Belgravia neighborhood on two sides before extending its full 7.2-kilometer length around Windsor Park and the University of Alberta campus. In addition, Belgravia contains two parks (Charles Simmonds Park and Belgravia Art Park), a suite of streets and avenues lined with American Elms, two pocket “triangle parks” on 118 Street and, of course, instant access to the River Valley from the Keillor Road pathway.

The benefits of the tree canopy on these public lands include shade, beauty, temperature regulation, “feel-good” pheromones, carbon capture and water absorption. Some researchers believe that “green infrastructure in urban areas... not only reduces the changes and mitigates the alterations caused by urbanization but also helps adapt to climate change” (K. Sabret and M. Sraj, “Can Urban Trees Reduce the Impact of Climate Change on Storm Runoff?”).

If trees could talk

The trees of Belgravia also hold stories. They are witnesses to the past, historians, symbol markers, legend keepers, and wonders of sustained tenacity. There are Lilacs and Lindens from old homestead properties on Saskatchewan Drive west intermingled with indigenous species like Chokecherry and Saskatoon, Poplar and Spruce, and Mountain Ash trees likely planted by birds.

According to a City of Edmonton report, the spaced, stately Elms in Belgravia were planted in the 1950s under the direction of parks planner Sandy Patterson, who faced opposition in his own Windsor Park neighborhood where some folks cut down the planted Elm saplings in protest that other trees were removed to make way for them.

In our neighbourhood there are memorial trees: at Belgravia school a tree commemorates a former student, and in the art park fruit trees mark a wedding that took place there and the invaluable contributions of a well-known Belgravia volunteer. There are new trees, Oaks and Pines, gracing the north “triangle park” (these pocket parks need names)!

At the southernmost fence of the Equine Centre, there are Juniper trees. Burnt and lopped trees left as insect and bird habitats on Saskatchewan Drive south of the End of the World viewpoint tell the story of a fire; they also recall a more recent blaze that was thankfully stopped by 16 firetrucks before it damaged more than one home in the neighborhood.

Saskatchewan Drive at its northernmost point in Belgravia is where my favourite tree lives – a huge Larch that turns gold in the fall. This tree was pointed out to me by a friend who does not live in the area. Since then, I always look for it on my way in and out of the neighborhood. It reminds me of my friend, and it, too, is my friend.

In winter, the huge Spruce decorated with lights on 119 St and 78 Avenue always thrills me. There are other trees on private property that are stunning specimens: Majestic Weeping Birch, Ponderosa Pine, Scots Pine and Horse Chestnut trees are all on my walking paths.

Trees give us our history but may also give us our future. The City of Edmonton has pledged to plant 2 million trees by 2050. Some, like Diana Beresford-Kroeger (To Speak for the Trees) say that trees are our only hope against climate change.

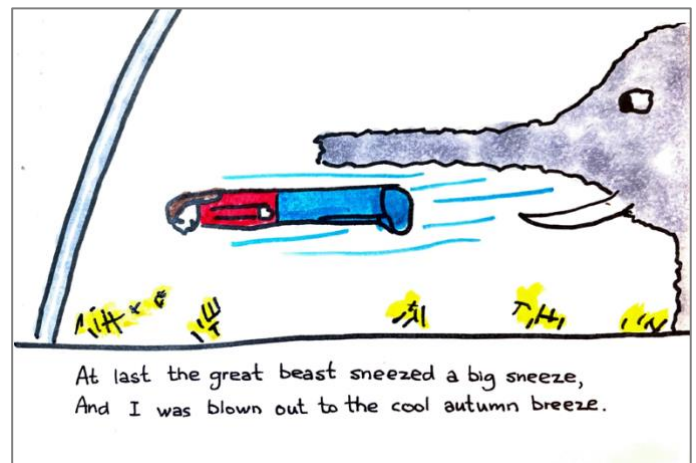
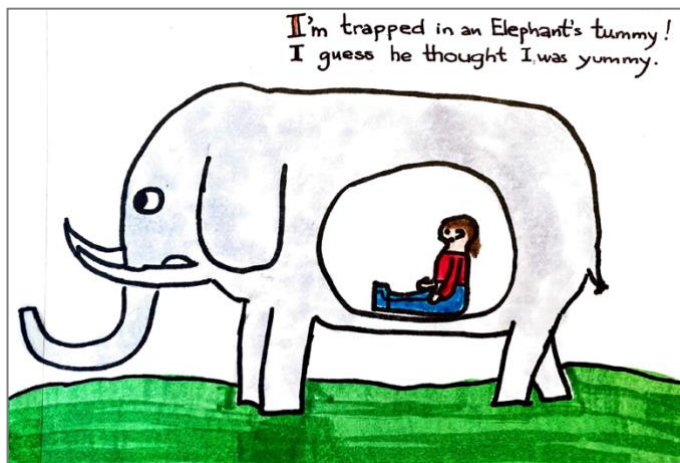
Trapped!
