# BCL Traffic Report

BCL continues to engage with the City on traffic issues. Here is the latest update from Traffic Operations staff:

**October 25, 2024:** Thank you for your follow-up email regarding the traffic flow on 76 Avenue and the redevelopment project located on the north side of 76 Avenue, west of 114 Street.

The contractor has committed to keeping all lanes of traffic on 76 Avenue open as much as possible during the current excavation phase of the project. However, the next phase of the project is beginning this weekend (Oct 26–27, 2024), which focuses on the foundation and structural work. This phase requires the full-time closure of the westbound lane, which is expected to continue until March 2025.

When the westbound curb lane is closed, the contractor will follow an approved traffic accommodation plan that provides:

- One westbound travel lane
- One eastbound travel lane that provides a thru movement and a right turn movement
- One left turn bay (eastbound to northbound)

We have also reviewed the traffic signal timings at the 114 Street and 76 Avenue intersection and added 5 seconds of green time for eastbound traffic.

Please note that a total closure of 76 Avenue (all lanes) is required for the assembly of a crane on site. The upcoming closure will occur this weekend from Friday, October 25 at 6:30 PM to Monday, October 28 at 6:00 AM.

The shortcutting occurring in Belgravia is not caused by Belgravia Heights development. It is an impact of the LRT line and addressing that would require major infrastructure changes such as moving the LRT track underground or aboveground. Many traffic safety measures have been put in place throughout the Belgravia neighbourhood over the past few years to help mitigate the shortcutting traffic and unsafe driving behaviours. To further address the potential of shortcutting traffic, we will install temporary Local Traffic Only signs along the side streets of University Avenue at Saskatchewan Drive, 119 Street and 115 Street in Belgravia by the end of October.

We will continue to monitor traffic flow on 76 Avenue at this location and conduct periodic inspections while making modifications to the traffic accommodation plan, if needed. We are committed to working closely with the contractor to address public safety for all modes of travel, including pedestrians, cyclists and motorists.

# Pat Galbraith: A Supporter of Neighbours

Pat Galbraith, Belgravia resident, renown sculptor, artist, and all-around good neighbour, passed away on November 17, 2024. Her home on 72 Ave was easy to spot. One of her earliest sculptures – *Alpha*, a boulder-sized concrete creation – graced her front yard while a beautifully carved marble polar bear, positioned at the edge of her walkway, invited passerbys to run a hand over its ever-so-smooth outline.

Pat was a neighbour who loved the children on her block. She welcomed them into her home, introducing them to the world of art and encouraging them to create something of their own, always offering fresh cookies to enjoy along the way. When the City's Abundant Community program was implemented by key members of the BCL, Pat enthusiastically helped make her block an 'awesome' one. With twinkling eyes, she would say it was possibly even the best block in Belgravia!

Her dedication to supporting others extended beyond her immediate neighbours. She was one of the first to embrace our *Made in Belgravia* (MIB) series, which brings residents together to share their skills, talents, knowledge and interests. MIB sessions often serve as a testing ground for future BCL programming. Pat's soapstone carving session turned into eight years of Soap-stone Carving classes at the hall, running from September 2016 to June 2024. When Pat retired from teaching these classes this past fall, her students formed a Soapstone Carving Club, with Pat promising to offer occasional guidance. They weren't yet prepared to let her go completely.

According to the BCL Holiday Market records, Pat had been registering a table at the market since at least 2010, where she sold her sculptures, watercolour paintings, and cards. Her talent as an artist was undeniable, and her willingness to help others develop their own creative abilities was equally apparent. She was as generous sharing her artistic talents as she was with the hundreds of cookies she made over the years for neighbours, her classes and BCL special events.

Pat's *Meet Your Neighbour* feature in April 2015 ended with a series of questions. A selection of her responses provides insight into what made her an exemplary neighbour:

- 1. What do you like best about Belgravia? "The residents."
- 2. What's the one item you can't live without? "Imagination."
- What's your guilty snack food pleasure?
  "I never feel guilty about snack foods; I just enjoy them."
- 4. What is your personal theme song? "What a Wonderful World by Louis Armstrong."
- 5. What are your words to live by? "What if ... ?"

Belgravia has been enriched by Pat Galbraith's presence. Her example of deep community involvement and her unwavering supporting for others will continue to inspire us all.

# Memories of Pat Galbraith

Pat was one of the first people to welcome us when we moved to Belgravia 14 years ago, across the street from her house. With a plate of cookies and a warm smile, she made us feel at home right away. She showed our kids endless love and patience, except for the time Arthur – who was about 4 years old at the time – hid in her large house during a visit. He stayed completely quiet, tucked away in a wardrobe, while we searched for him everywhere. After a while, when it wasn't funny anymore, I called Arthur's dad and put him on speakerphone to help coax Arthur out. For some time after that, Pat still loved seeing Arthur, so long as he stayed out of her house. We laughed many times when we remembered that day.

Pat always encouraged us as parents. I don't think she knew how much that meant to us, but hearing her say, "Your kids are so lucky to have you as parents," when we doubted ourselves really stuck with us. It was just one example of how supportive she was. She also seemed to know when we needed help, like the time I was staring at an empty fridge and Pat knocked on our door. "I think I made too much soup. Can you help me eat it?"

Pat and I both enjoyed growing food and had fun sharing seeds and plants. We loved watching things grow and exchanging samples of our harvests during the summers and falls. One summer, when we came home after being away for a month, Pat welcomed us back (with cookies) and asked if I had seen our backyard yet. "Yes, it's amazing! Everything's grown like crazy," I said, noticing the huge zucchini plant and giant tomatoes. Pat humbly replied, "You might stand a chance now. Against the dandelions." What I hadn't seen was what wasn't there anymore: 3 large garbage bags full of dandelions, carefully pulled out one by one from our lawn, which had once been covered in yellow flowers. Pat handed me her well-used tools to help continue the battle against the weeds.

During the pandemic, when most kids' activities were cancelled, Pat carved little soapstone figures and organized sessions for neighbourhood kids to polish them on her (dandelion-free!) front lawn. Those little figures are now precious mementos we'll always cherish.

We feel so lucky to have had Pat as a neighbour, friend, and extra grandma.

We will miss her deeply.

# New Resources for Block Connectors

The Abundant Belgravia initiative helps build a culture of care, foster a sense of belonging, and create a healthier, more liveable city – one block at a time.
