Thanks to Don Wilson and his rink team, the BCL rink opened before Christmas. As a BCL supported project, we ask all those who use the rink to purchase a current BCL membership. We do not have the resources to check for skate tags at our rink. However, if you wish to skate at other community league rinks where skate tags are checked, please request one at: membership@belgraviaedmonton.ca

Ours is a family rink and we ask that people respect the skating schedule as outlined below.

RINK CODE OF CONDUCT

- No alcohol, smoking or foul language.
- Carry out what you carry in. The BCL does not have a janitorial service and depends on volunteers to help keep the area litter free.
- The rink is closed during maintenance. Please respect the efforts of the volunteers and stay off the ice until the rink is ready.
- You can help out by clearing the ice when you are finished skating. Snow shovels and blades can be found around the rink area.
- The schedule as outlined below is also posted at the rink gate. On statutory holidays, the Saturday schedule must be followed.
- All skaters must give way to the designated skater group.

RINK RENEWAL PROJECT UPDATE

The Belgravia Community League’s outdoor rink replacement project is steadily moving forward. Based on community feedback and anticipated costs, the BCL Board has decided to replace the current rink with a new grass surface rink, maintaining the same size. The new rink will feature modern boarding, improved lighting and upgraded drainage. The total estimated cost is projected to be between \$300,000 and \$350,000.

Concept Phase

Funding for the rink will come from a combination of BCL funding, City of Edmonton’s CLIP (Community League Infrastructure Program) grants, and community fundraising. To date, we have secured a \$25,000 planning grant from the City through the CLIP program. In addition, the BCL Board has committed to the league providing \$150,000 in funding. Our next step is to hire a consultant to develop a preliminary design and cost estimate, which are required to obtain City approval before moving forward with the project.

Fundraising

In the summer of 2025, we will begin seeking donation pledges from Belgravia residents. Our goal is to raise \$50,000 through community contributions.

In January 2026, we will apply for a larger CLIP grant. These grants are matching funds, and the amount we request will depend on the pledges raised from the community and the funding committed by the BCL Board. The City will announce the results of this CLIP application in April 2026.

Design and Build

If we are successful in securing both community funding and the second CLIP grant, we will hire a contractor to complete the detailed design and prepare a bid slate for the demolition of the existing rink and construction of the new rink. We anticipate that construction will take place over the summer and fall of 2026, with the new rink ready for the 2027 season.

Meet Your Neighbours

HOWARD SAUNDERS AND LEE ONISKO

Howard Saunders, a lover of all kinds of music, first heard Lee Onisko on her CKUA radio show and “fell in love with her voice.” After years of telephone calls while she was on the air, Howard arranged a face-to-face date. They later married on the anniversary of that date, and he moved from Calgary and settled into the Belgravia home that Lee had lived in since 1996.

Lee and Howard enjoyed diverse areas of work before their retirements. Howard, a long-time Calgary furniture and appliance retailer, later worked on masonry restoration of the historic McLeod Building in downtown Edmonton and ended his employment life as “the guy” in the gardening department of the Strathcona Home Depot. Among many jobs, Lee was a social worker, window dresser, mall decorator, proofreader, writer, editor, music librarian, children’s bookseller and, from 1993 to 2000, a producer, programmer and presenter at CKUA. Alberta’s listener-supported “voice for music, arts and culture,” CKUA was founded in 1927 and is a much-beloved institution for music fans throughout the province.

When CKUA went off the air for five weeks in 1997 in the wake of a series of disruptive changes to its funding and governance models, Lee was part of a team of staff and devoted donors that saved the station and led it to the success that it continues to enjoy. In fact, Lee was hosting a marathon meeting of the team at her Belgravia house when the news of the shutdown arrived. Soon after that meeting and in that same living room, CKUA’s David Ward and Lee hatched a plan to tour the province to visit (and tune up in anticipation of a return to the air) the station’s 17 Alberta transmitters in what became the legendary *Touch the Transmitter Tour*. The emotional five-day trip connecting with the CKUA community was transformative for Lee.

That storied Belgravia house was also central to the new adventure that Lee and Howard began in 2021. As they planned for retirement, they wanted to find a way to affordably stay in Belgravia and to provide affordable housing for others as well. They decided to build a “laneway house” in the large yard behind the original house, an arrangement that is unusual in Belgravia. Lee and Howard moved into their new net-zero house in 2022, along with their collection of over 4,000 record albums. They rent their old house to two sets of lovely tenants.

While still in the throes of redesign, their property is a showcase for Howard’s passion for gardening. Meanwhile, Lee has begun to entertain Belgravians with her local-themed crossword puzzles. (Lee: *Tibetan turquoise goddess?* Really?!)

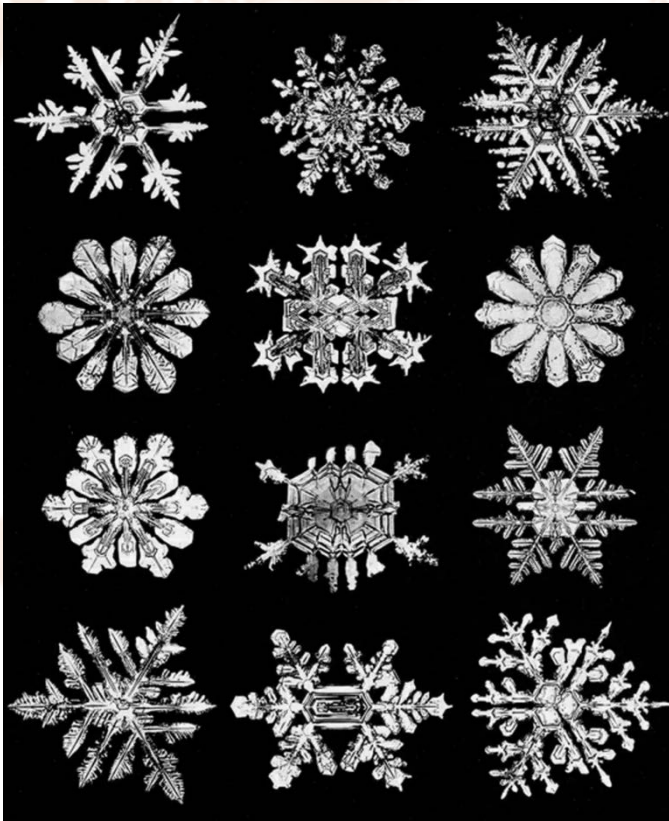
